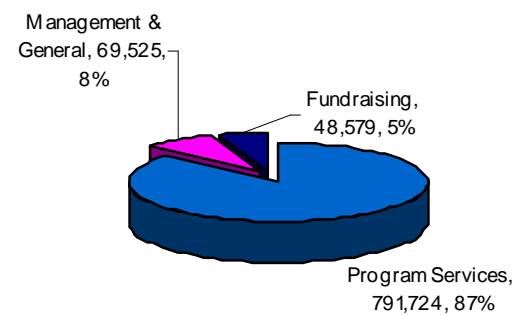

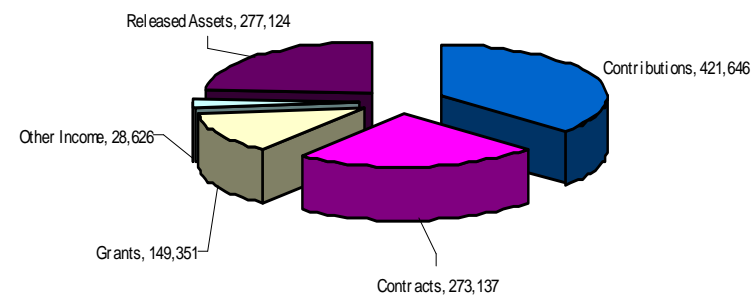

Moving Forward with Integrity

East End Community Services is extremely honored to have received the 2005 Better Business Bureau Non-Profit Eclipse Integrity Award. The Integrity Award is presented to a nonprofit or charity every year demonstrating outstanding community service through its mission and accomplishments. As a winner, East End Community Services was judged to practice ethical and responsible fund raising, demonstrate strong board oversight and fiscal responsibility, have measurable results reported honestly, promote the vitality and overall health of our community and demonstrate regular, effective communications with our stakeholders. We are proud to have received such a prestigious award. We pledge to our neighbors and our funders to continue the tradition of excellent stewardship of the resources that you entrust in us.



Consistent with our pledge to promote the vitality of the community, East End served more than 2,000 individuals and provided more than 50,000 service units during 2005. We provided children and families with after school and summer programs, a virtual charter high school, adult employment services, family case management, a children's health clinic in partnership with Reach Out of Montgomery County, and activities that promote a sense of community safety and well-being. The Board and neighborhood collaborated on a plan for the physical revitalization of the neighborhood. The Twin Towers Crossing Housing Strategy was approved by the City in '05, with implementation beginning in '06.

Much of the work we do involves collaboration with some of the best partners any agency could have: Artemis Domestic Violence Alternatives, East End Community School, the Greater Dayton YMCA, Reach Out of Montgomery County and University of Dayton. **Thanks for all you do!**

Sarah, a young single mother with three children, has been involved in pre-apprenticeship classes through East End's partnership with the Home Builders Association as well as computer training at our office. These steps have led to her securing and maintaining an excellent job with benefits.

Stories of Opportunity

Miracle Makers' children scored higher on the Terra Nova test than a comparison group from the same school that did not attend Miracle Makers. The children scored nearly 10 percentage points higher in math and reading and five points higher in language. The children also gained social and behavioral skills.

Youth Center's survey of teens found that 79% of those involved in tutoring or attending our virtual high school are achieving significant academic progress. This year, 97% remained in school and 98% of youth who attended regularly did not become pregnant. Surveys showed that teens also increased their personal assets.

Family and Job Connections placed 117 persons in jobs. The program assisted a total of 464 persons with case management and other services to stabilize their families and improved their ability to become self-sufficient.

Latino Family Advocacy and Milagro de Mujer (Miracle of Women) assisted 218 Latinos with case management or other services. A dance troupe, Sol Azteca, grew out of efforts to empower the women.

Community Building initiatives gained momentum in 2005. A comprehensive strategy was developed to improve the housing and amenities in Twin Towers. Dedicated efforts by staff, neighbors and the broader community led to progress in addressing area crime, including closing drug houses.
