Neighbors Helping Neighbors

2006 was a year of accomplishment as East End Community Services worked with neighbors on building a prosperous, healthy and caring community. Transforming a community starts with individual success for children, teens, adults and the elderly. Toward that goal, we reached more than 2,000 individuals through services to children and teens as well as employment services, case management, housing, health, cultural events, Latino advocacy and outreach.

One of our proudest accomplishments was moving ahead with our plans to improve 25 percent of the area homes. We assisted homeowners with urgent repairs in 2006 and laid the ground work for a new program in 2007 which targeted elderly homeowners. Our neighbors and area youth contributed more than 1,500 volunteer hours helping others with family crisis, working on community goals and repairing homes. In partnership with CityFolk, we began celebrating the diverse cultures of the neighborhood through a neighborhood "Barn Dance" that included performers Santiago Jiminez and Rhythm and Shoes. These cultural events will continue in 2007-2008.

The efforts of our neighbors have been matched by the generous contributions of donors, program funders, and organizational partners, including: Artemis, CityFolk, East End Community School, K-12 Gallery, Reach Out, Incarnation Parish, Sinclair Fast Forward, University of Dayton and Wright State University.

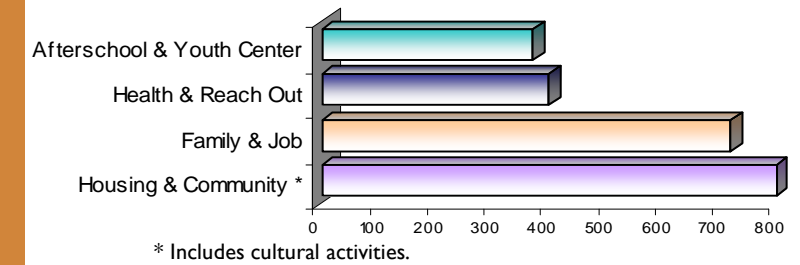
They were always there when I needed them the most, for anything. So then I started looking for a job because I was tired of the way we were living. I also wanted to go to College to better my life for me and my children.

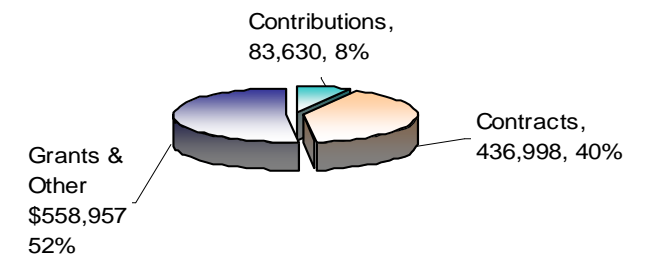
I would just like to say that the staff at East End are angels and they have changed my family's lives and helped us in so many ways. I don't even know how to thank them.

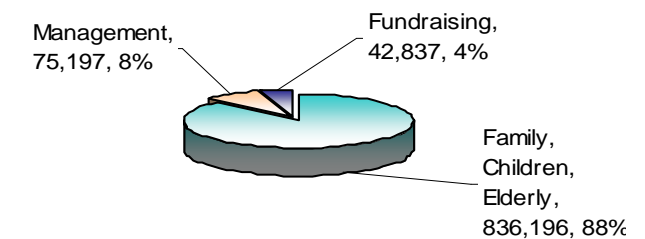
2006 Populations Served
